Kairakuen Garden, one of the three great gardens of Japan, was originally built by Nariaki

Tokugawa in 1842. In the garden, approximately 3,000 plum trees of 100 varieties are grown and their blossoms give off subtle fragrance in early spring. Other spring flowers such as cherry blossoms and azaleas, and autumn flowers like bush clovers bloom beautifully. Kobuntei, a historic three-story building in the garden, still conveys Mito samurai character and atmosphere, and from the 3rd floor you can enjoy panoramic view looking out over Lake Senba.

3 Lake Senba MAP D-6 Senba-cho, Mito



A gourd-shaped lake, located in the southeast of Kairakuen Garden. The cherry-tree walkways along Lake Senba is fit for walking and jogging. There is a lakeside cafe, which is popular among the locals as an oasis of calm and natural beauty. Swan-shaped pedalos and rowing boats are available to rent at this lake.

4 Tokugawa Museum MAP A-6

This is the only museum that houses a huge collection of materials passed down from the Mito Tokugawa Family. The collection is comprised of approximately 30,000 articles inherited mainly from the first Tokugawa Shogun, leyasu, along with those of successive domain lords and their wives, and 30,000 written materials that were gathered for the compilation of "Dainihonshi (Great History of Japan). The belongings of Shogun Yoshinobu as well as the famous "Inro" (small lacquered case) owned by Lord Mitsukuni are also on display.

5 The Museum of Modern Art, Ibaraki MAP F-7

Located near heautiful Lake Senba, this art museum has more than 4,000 modern art works from Japan and abroad, including pieces by Taikan Yokovama (born in Mito). Usen Ogawa and Tsune Nakamura (from Ibaraki) as well as Monet. Renoir and Pissarro, Every season regular exhibition from the collection is replaced.

Tokiwa-jinja Shrine is dedicated to two influential feudal lords of Mito Domain: the 2nd lord Mitsukuni Tokugawa and the 9th Nariaki Tokuqawa. In the Giretsukan museum, visitors can view artifacts such as a historic war drum.

This museum collects and exhibits articles related to the history of Ibaraki Prefecture. Visitors can see a historic water mill and the old building of Mitsukaido Elementary School (originallybuiltin 1881), which was relocated and reconstructed. Items related to "Shogun" Yoshinobu are also exhibited in the Hitotsubashi Tokuqawa Memorial Room.

8 Birthplace of Mito Komon MAP 1-6

Mitsukuni Tokugawa, other wise known as Mito Komon, was born at the house of his father's retainer, Miki Nihei-yukitsugu, in 1628. He was raised as a member of the Miki family until he was 4. Currently, the Mito Komon Shrine resides on this place.

This shrine was built by the first feudal lord of Mito domain, Yorifusa Tokugawa, in dedication to his father leyasu Tokugawa. Today, Yorifusa is also enshrined here. In the precincts, visitors can see the copper lanterns donated by Yorifusa.


No trip to Mito would be complete without sampling some natto, a popular Japanese savoury food made from fermented soy beans - are you up to the challenge?


